- 7:16PM- The following information is strictly regarding the HERNANDO WATER TOWER 10K RACE AND FESTIVAL on Saturday, October 7, 2017. Mark your calendars! This event is this weekend! For volunteers, we will have three tables set up throughout the race course. We need 2-3 volunteers at each table and there will be directions at each table. You will pour water into paper cups and runners will take the cups and throw them on the ground on their way. You will have to pick the cups up off the ground and put them in plastic garbage bags. Volunteers will also be set up in front of the county administration, in front of the water fountain. People will need to have posters for parking.

We now have posters! Some volunteers will have to be set up at the finish line with posters reading "AFTER RACE PARTY" which will direct the runners to Losher Street, where AC's Steakhouse is. The after race party will be at the courtyard behind AC's Steakhouse. In total, we

have four posters for the after race party with parking direction on the back. Another 4 posters will be used to cheer on the runners!

We have put you in groups and Mrs. Gia Matheny will give you specific directions on the morning of the Water Tower 10K race.

Police cars will indicate when the race will be over.

Volunteers of the 10K are more than welcome to come to the after-race party. Unless you run in the race, you cannot sit in the seats. The seats are meant for the tired runners! You also are not eligible to get a door prize unless a runner. If anyone wants to run in the race, you can get community service hours for participating. You can also get 50% off your registry for the race!

After Friday, September 22, 2017, tickets went up to \$30 from the previous \$25 ticket. Mayor's Youth Council members can pay \$15 if they wish to participate in the Water Tower 10K. Dress accordingly in comfortable clothes for the Water Tower 10K Festival (IT'S FALL).

 - 1. Direct for parking.
 - 2. Direct for after-race party and stand near the finish line at Losher Street. Direct runners to the entrance at AC's Steakhouse to the back parking lot.
 - 3. This team requires posters.
 - o Team II:

- 1. Help at registration table and help adult volunteers pass out t-shirts.
- Hand out medals for the participants once they finish the 10K as they cross the finish line.
- Keep an eye on water to make sure extras are replenished in ice chest and adult volunteers will help.
- 4. When all runners are finished, take rolling ice chests to the after-race party and adult volunteers will help.

o Team III:

- Water Table 2 is located at the tennis courts at Church Park on the corner of East Center Street and Northview Street.
- 2. Directions for the water table will be located in the bag on the water table and please follow the directions listed!
- 3. Direct runners from East Center Street to Northview Street.
- 4. This team requires a restroom poster and one to cheer on the runners.
- Volunteers will hop in the back of the Hernando Police Department pickup truck and follow the last runner to the finish line or they can leave once the runner comes through.

o Team IV:

- Water Table 3 is located at the corner of Northwood West Drive and Robertson Road.
- 2. Directions for the water table will be located in the bag on the water table and please follow the directions listed!
- 3. This team requires a poster to cheer on the runners.

4. Volunteers will hop in the back of the Hernando Police Department pickup truck and follow the last runner to the finish line or they can leave once the last runner comes through.

o Team V:

- 1. This team will be located at West Robertson Street and Elm Street.
- 2. This team requires a poster to cheer on the runners.
- Direct runners to Elm Street and remember not to block the street once they run.
 Each member of your team will stand on the opposite side of the street to see them come up to the road.
- 4. Volunteers will hop in the back of the Hernando Police Department pickup truck and follow the last runner to the finish line or they can leave once the last runner comes through. Volunteers of this team can walk to the after-race party.

o Team VI:

- 1. This team requires a poster to cheer on the runners.
- 2. This team will be located at West Robinson Street and Timber Lane.
- Direct runners from West Robinson Street to Timber Lane and remember not to block the street when they run. Each member of your team will stand on opposite side of the street to see them come up to the road.
- 4. Volunteers will hop in the back of the Hernando Police Department pickup truck and follow the last runner to the finish line or they can leave once the last runner comes through. Volunteers of this team can walk to the after-race party.

o Team VII:

1. This team requires a poster to cheer on the runners.

- 2. This team will be located at Railroad Avenue and East Center Street.
- Direct runners from Railroad Avenue to East Center Street and Timber Lane.
 Remember not to block the street when they run. You will want to stand on opposite side of the street to see them come up to the road.
- 4. Volunteers will hop in the back of the Hernando Police Department pickup truck and follow the last runner to the finish line or they can leave once the last runner comes through. Volunteers of this team can walk to the after-race party.

- 1. Please ask for Tracy Williams, our lead adult volunteer, for the after-race party duty.
- 2. Please remind other volunteers that they can attend the after-race party but they will need to leave the chairs for the runners and wait until all participants are finished before they can get food. This is usually around 10AM. Volunteers can have water sooner!
