INTRODUCTION:

Mr. Mike Davis with The Reaves Firm is requesting approval to rezone 236.4 acres of land from PBP Planned Business Park to M-1 Light Industrial.

BACKGROUND:

The subject property is Parcel No. 208736000 0000300 and is located on the west of Highway 51 and north of I-69 and is currently zoned PBP Planned Business Park. The subject property was rezoned from A Agricultural to PBP Planned Business Park with Planning Commission recommendation on March 8, 2005, and Board of Aldermen approval on April 19, 2005. This resulted in the Hernando Commerce Center Planned Business Park Master Plan.

DISCUSSION:

The applicant is requesting approval to rezone the property from PBP Planned Business Park to M-1 Light Industrial.

Article XVIII Amendments of the City of Hernando Zoning Ordinance allows for the amendment of the text or map of the Zoning Ordinance provided the applicant demonstrates the appropriateness of the change and address the following criteria for the zoning amendment.

1. How the proposed amendment would conform to the General Development Plan.

Applicant: With regard to use, the proposed amendment to rezone the entire property to M-1 is somewhat consistent with the General Development plan as it dictates light industrial uses for a majority of the property. It differs in use along the Highway 51 corridor as the General Development plan shows mixed use / retail uses. Reversal of the property to straight zoning from the current Planned Business Park category provides an approval path more palatable to future light industrial development while still providing protection for the City of Hernando through existing ordinances.

Planning Staff: The Future Land Use Plan of the City's Comprehensive Plan shows the subject property designated as Distribution Districts. Within the text of the Comprehensive Plan, the Distribution Districts are defined as areas for large warehouse and distribution activities. The requested zoning of M-1 Light Industrial will meet this requirement.

2. Why the existing zoning district classification of the property in question is inappropriate or improper.

Applicant: The property owner, when seeking light industrial zoning in 2005 reluctantly agreed, as directed by the planning staff at the time, to place the property under the Planned Business zoning category. The intent of staff was to position the property to attract a major corporate user that would develop the site in a campus-like environment. In reality, the City of Hernando has not been targeted by major corporations for this type of facility. Potential end users are more likely to resemble the attractive modern light industrial facilities constructed in recent years to the north in Southaven and to the east in Olive Branch.

<u>Planning Staff</u>: The current zoning of PBP Planned Business Park is intended to create a campus-like setting out of large parcels of land. The owner of the subject property intends to develop the property for a single use large area facility without the commercial or office areas across the Highway 51 frontage as was previously approved as part of the rezoning from A Agricultural to PBP Planned Business Park. The PBP Planned Business Park will not accommodate the proposed development of a single use large facility.

3. That major economic, physical, or social changes, if any, have occurred in the vicinity of the property in question that were not anticipated by the General Development Plan and have substantially altered the basic character of the area, which make the proposed amendment to the Zoning District Map appropriate;

<u>Applicant</u>: The General Development Plan anticipated development of a retail corridor along Highway 51 from the Nesbit I-55 interchange to Green T Road. In reality, retail/commercial development continues to be limited to the Commerce and McIngvale corridors. Construction of the future Mcingvale I-269 interchange and future improvements to the Commerce I-55 interchange will further strengthen those corridors as the major Hernando retail activity centers. Commercial demand along the Highway 51 corridor north of I-69 will be spotty and local in nature.

By contrast, the Highway 51 corridor in Desoto County has, in the last fifteen years, become attractive to major distribution and light industrial developers due to direct proximity to the interstate system and close proximity to Federal Express and other major shipping facilities at Memphis International Airport. Light industrial facilities have been, or are being constructed, from Church Road to Star Landing Road in Southaven on vacant farm land. That growth will

logically continue to the south and approach the subject property in the near future.

The completion of I-269 and the commitment from the Mississippi Department of Transportation to build the Mcingvale interchange have dramatically changed the future character of the area. The subject property will now have almost direct access to the Interstate system, via Green T Road. That was not the case when the subject property was rezoned in 2005.

The major site characteristics sought by light industrial end users: access to major transportation systems, direct access to water and sewer infrastructure and fl.at/open topography are now readily available to the subject property. Light industrial demand will increase accordingly, in tune with the current and foreseeable market demand.

<u>Planning Staff</u>: When the subject property was rezoned to PBP Planned Business Park the only access to highway transportation was Highway 51 and the Interstate 55 interchange at Pleasant Hill Road. Last year Interstate 269 opened its entire route through DeSoto County. With the approval of the McIngvale Road realignment, MDOT implemented the construction of an interchange at the intersection of McIngvale Road and I-269. This will allow for multiple options for interstate access from the subject property. This additional option was not available in 2005 when the site was rezoned to PBP Planned Business Park.

STAFF COMMENTS:

- 1. The request before you is for the rezoning of the property from PBP Planned Business Park to M-1 Light Industrial.
- 2. If approved, the previously approved conditions of approval for the Hernando Commerce Center Planned Business Park will no longer be in effect.
- 3. If approved, the bulk regulation for the M-1 Light Industrial Zoning District will guide the development of the land.

- 4. If approved, the development of the property shall begin with Certificate of Development approval.
- 5. After Certificate of Development approval, full construction plans shall be submitted for Building Permit Approval. The plans shall be reviewed for Building Code and Fire Code compliance before issuance of a building permit.

PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION:

The Planning Commission met on Tuesday, January 14, 2020, and voted to recommend approval to the Board of Aldermen the rezoning of Parcel No. 208736000 0000300 a 236.4-acres of land located on the West Side of Highway 51 and North Side of I-69 from PBP Planned Business Park to M-1 Light Industrial, subject to Staff Comments.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Because the requested zoning is in harmony with the City's Future Land Use Plan and is reflective of the new transportation access from the subject property to Interstate 69, Staff recommends approval subject to staff comments.






