Alderman McLendon asked if we controlled the parking in front of the library.

Alderman Higdon stated that 1 ½ hours seemed good to him.

Mayor Johnson asked that if someone parks there to go into court, how we would handle them.

Alderman Miller stated that it needs to be a joint effort with the City and County. Mr. Miller also stated that it will be hard to enforce, we don't have enough officers to handle that.

Alderman Hobbs asked why we don't get meters. Mr. Hobbs stated that they will pay for themselves.

Mayor Johnson stated that might not help businesses, their customers will then have to pay to park. They probably won't like that. Mayor Johnson also stated that we draft a letter to MDOT or the County from the Board.

Alderman Lauderdale suggested that we do signage. He stated that if we had someone that continued to park there, we could talk with them. Mr. Lauderdale stated that we should speak with the county.

Mayor Johnson asked if there was anyone that would join a committee with Alderman Higdon and himself.

Alderwoman Brooks stated that McLendon said he would.

Mayor Johnson stated that the committee will get together and speak to the county, maybe with some business owners also, and get back with the Board.
